At the beginning of the academic year, our Y12 students were very fortunate to listen to a lecture by Stephanie Brobbey. In her talk, she addressed what her job entailed as a private wealth solicitor and why she left this lucrative career to establish the 'Good Ancestor Movement'. In her lecture, she explained that the catalyst for change was when a friend told her that there were more food banks than McDonald's branches in the UK. Recently, she has written a though-provoking article for *The Guardian* in which she said: "A boom in billionaire wealth should be no cause for celebration at a time when many people in the country cannot afford to heat their homes and put food on the table. While inflation, which effectively becomes a tax on ordinary people, spirals out of control, the wealthiest remain largely shielded from tax."
