Maths Competitions

On Wednesday 5th October, all Year 12 and 13 Mathematicians undertook the Senior Mathematics Challenge. This is a 90 minute collection of problem-solving questions with multiple choice answers that test your mental agility and numerical dexterity. We await the students' results later in November. The whole of Years 7 and 8 will undertake the Junior Mathematics Challenge and selected students from Years 9 to 11 the Intermediate Mathematics Challenge later in the academic year.
